Devesh Srivastava takes charge as CMD of General Insurance Corporation of India



Devesh Srivastava on 18th Dec took charge as the **Chairman and Managing director** of **General Insurance Corporation of India**.

His name was recommended by Banks Board Bureau in August this year, and the government issued notification for his appointment on Tuesday.

Srivastava, a direct recruit officer of 1987 batch, began his career with Oriental Insurance Company Ltd. Subsequently, his services were transferred to GIC in 1999.

He holds a post graduate degree in Physics.

<u>India has become the world's third largest publisher of science and engineering articles</u>

India has become the **world's third largest publisher of science and engineering articles**, according to a US government agency data, **topped by China**.

As per the statistics compiled by the **US National Science Foundation (NSF)**, the number of scientific papers published worldwide increased from 1,755,850 in 2008 to 2,555,959 in 2018.

The data, which was released on Tuesday, stated that in 2008, India published 48,998 science and engineering articles. This increased to 1,35,788 articles in 2018 at an average annual growth rate of 10.73 per cent and the country now accounts for 5.31 per cent of the total world publications in science and engineering.

China, which accounts for 20.67 per cent of all global publications in scientific articles, is at the top position, followed by the US at 16.54 per cent.

The other countries which made it to the top 10 list are Germany (1,04,396), Japan (98,793), UK (97,681), Russia (81,579), Italy (71,240), South Korea (66,376) and France (66,352).

40% Indian women fear online trolls as they access Internet: Nielson report

While education and career development are top priorities for women Internet users in India, **40 percent** of them fear irrelevant comments, being trolled and followed on smartphones which has become a preferred choice for them to remain online.

While **44 percent** of women in Indian metros access online content in English to improve their soft skills and stay "job-ready," this focus is sharper among younger women between the 18-23 age group, said the Verizon Media survey conducted by Nielsen with 1,300 respondents in 12 cities.

Across locations, younger women were found to access more content related to education, career growth and skill development, while older women between 29-35 years of age accessed more online video content related to personal well-being.

The internet is empowering a new breed of Indian women who are coming online and preparing to take their place in the workforce. The right platform and support as a community will enable greater inclusion, boosting participation of Indian women at the workplace.

India-US 2+2 ministerial dialogue in Washington

India-US 2+2 ministerial dialogue is scheduled to take place in **Washington** on **18**th **December** where the two countries are likely to exchange views on salient regional and global issues.

US State Department will be hosting the second annual US-India 2+2 Ministerial Dialogue led by Secretary of State Mike Pompeo and Secretary of Defence, Mark Esper with their Indian counterparts, Minister of External Affairs S Jaishankar and Minister of Defence Rajnath Singh.

Navy chief will visit Sri Lanka to bolster maritime ties

Indian Navy Chief Admiral Karambir Singh will leave for **Sri Lanka** on Thursday on a **four-day visit** to "**consolidate and enhance**" the bilateral maritime relations between the two countries.

The visit of the Indian Chief of Naval Staff (CNS) comes a month after newly-elected Sri Lankan President Gotabhaya Rajapaksa came to India.

Singh will hold bilateral discussions with Vice Admiral Piyal De Silva, Commander of Sri Lanka Navv.

The Karambir Singh will also take part as the chief guest during the commissioning and passing out parade of the '60th Intake Midshipmen' scheduled to be conducted at the Naval Maritime Academy, Trincomalee, on December 22.

December 18: International Migrants Day



CBI officer wins' India Cyber Cop of the Year' award



CBI officer B P Raju has won the 'India Cyber Cop of the Year 2019' award by NASSCOM-DSCI for cracking a fraud case in an online entrance exam conducted by an engineering college in Rajasthan.

The award was given to Raju by Secretary, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Ajay Prakash Sawhney, during the annual Information Security Summit held at Gurgaon.

Raju had investigated the case and exposed the fraud in the online entrance examination. The investigation team headed by B P Raju, arrested nine accused persons and collected incriminating evidence from digital devices, which revealed the modus operandi adapted by the accused. The investigation was also completed within the stipulated time period.
